Miss Louise A. Boyd Will Go North This Summer

Has Twice Before Explored Polar Regions

Journey Will Be Made in Interest of Science

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 25. (Exclusive)-The rigors of Arctic exploration, frozen seas and barren lands, hold no terrors for Miss Louiso A. Boyd, San Francisco heiress and society woman. thrilling polar expeditions to her credit. which brought her recognition from three European governments and won her numerous trophics through her skill with gun and camera, she will set out again this summer into the wastes far north of the Arctic Circle, this time in the interests of science.

The forthcoming voyage is to be made under auspices of the National Geographic Society and a group of scientists selected by the society will accompany Miss Boyd and her party of friends.

"I am going to make the expedi-tion I had planned for the summ-r of 1928." said Miss Boyd today. That trip was abandoned in order that we might aid, instead, in the search for Roald Amundsen and the surrivors of the ill-fated dirigible,

"I have chartered the Norwegian ship Voslekari, and with my party ericted to sail July I for the richeast coast of Greenland and the Island of Jan Neyea. We shall probably do a good deal of hydrophotography, gathering of specimens and possibly some seal and polar bear hunting.
